I'm know that your situation is difficult and tries your patience and self-control...but just hang in there because the Lord Jesus is coming soon! I am grateful that the Father has given us that hope. It just seems to me that things are getting worse by the day. Evil seems to have gotten the go ahead by Father God to begin the count-down to His Sons soon return. The moral decay in America is shameful and appalling! I marvel at God's patience and mercy, but I do believe His judgment will come sooner rather than later.

I know that your lives are going through some time of testing, but rest assured all will turn out fine. Life is tough right now for all of us and I just wish that those who claim to know Jesus, including you and me, would be more consistent in our testimony. If that would happen, then I think the Church would grow. Please stay the course and flee from the dark side of prison life. Rest assured that Marilyn and I will be praying for your safety and the Holy Spirit's peace.

We just graduated 40 from "Preach the Gospel" from our Men on Mission and we are now learning How to Win in Spiritual Warfare. This is a wonderful workbook on how to get the victory over situation when you know you being attacked by the enemy and how you should respond with the "fruits of the Spirit". Not always easy, but then life is not easy or fair. Someone or something is always trying to defeat us, but thank God for Jesus and the Holy Spirit! Just do what you can to remain obedient and faithful because He is coming with His reward for those who live and preach the Gospel.

Bond-servants, obey in everything those who are your earthly masters, not by way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but with sincerity of heart, fearing the Lord. Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ. Colossians 3: 22-24

Next we went to Indiana where we spent 3 fun-filled days at the home of Aunt Betty who we haven't seen in 26 years. We laughed a lot as we reminisced; she fed us some delicious home cooked meals and treated us to a play. Marilyn's Cousin Cindy and her husband Mike drove over from Ohio to visit with us while we were there too.

After returning home on July 29th we began putting together our ministry calendar for the rest of the year. Dan's schedule stays basically the same with 17 services a month, driving 900 miles to the six prisons where he conducts Bible studies and worship services for the Hispanic population. Marilyn will be volunteering with Kairos Prison Ministry spending three and a half days in the women's prison presenting a condensed course on basic Christianity and ministering the Love of Christ. She also has 6 speaking engagements at various Christian Women's Clubs around the state.

Recently at one of the men's prisons, Dan showed an amazing DVD that featured different Hispanic men and women giving their Christian testimonies. They spoke about what their life was like before Christ. They told how they came to the Lord and how their new life as a Christian has been

enriched since making a decision for Jesus. ...And more importantly, how they are allowing Him to be Lord of their lives. On this particular day, Dan noticed that there were several new inmates in the congregation. He also noticed that one of the new men cried while watching as a woman from Mexico City who spoke of her life growing up in the city dump (yes whole families live in the dump) scavenging through mountains of garbage for food, and any discarded items that could be sold for recycling. She lived in the filth, enduring "bone crushing" poverty which led to a life of crime. Cecilia lived with no hope, she was in and out of prison and her future looked bleak until one day some lady volunteers came to visit the prison. They told her about the Good News of Jesus Christ. She eventually repented and invited the Lord into her heart. Now Cecilla runs a home for 500 boys and girls who are mentally and physically handicapped. The young man who was crying during the video told Dan that that was the way he was raised and that he was glad he came to prison because it was in prison that he heard the Gospel two years ago and turned his life over to Jesus. It always amazes us how God can use incarceration to get someone's attention and to find out how thankful they are that they had come to prison. They are truly "free on the inside" while serving Him during their time of incarceration. The Lord's Spirit is convicting the convicted to repent and live for Him.



Our car was fixed after the accident and it took us 6,546 miles in the month of July!

As we were winding up the worship service at the women's prison last week Dan asked if there was anyone who wanted to surrender their life to the Lord. Three women came to the front of the chapel. One of the inmates (Trina) came forward with her friend Carol. Trina explained that she and Carol had been cellmates during their incarceration in county jail and that they were now dorm mates in the prison. Carol had lost her hearing when she was a child which left her totally deaf. Since Trina knows sign language, she has been a great blessing in helping Carol understand what's going on in her silent world. With Trina signing the sinner's prayer Carol repeated the words accepting Jesus as her Lord and Savior. What a precious sight this was. All of us at the alter and many of the women in the congregation shared with her tears of joy.
